
A BELOYED ARTIST & STATE CHAMPION

Exciting changes continued at Luther Manor as our \$9 million Project Revitalization was completed in late December of 2024! Quite the Christmas gift! This two-year transformation will enhance, and has already improved, residents' lives and elevate our already beautiful, park-like campus. The project includes aesthetic improvements and updates focusing on increasing community safety and security, including:



New entrances at our 92nd St. North Entrance as well as The Terrace and The Courtyards. A refreshed outdoor patio in the Courtyards, with expanded seating for enjoying time outdoors. A revamped ice cream parlor turned into The Courtyards Great Room Café & Lounge, offering more snack options, and creating a welcoming space for residents and their families to gather for games, movies, and special events. A new beauty salon in the space of our previous 92nd St entrance in The Courtyards. A new dining and activities space in our Health Care Center, along with a new nurse call system. The Lanterns - a new and improved therapy gym and rehab center. The Magnolia Garden - a revamped outdoor garden just behind our Welcome Center.

Project Revitalization reflects our commitment to providing an enriching, secure, and vibrant environment for all who call Luther Manor home!





INTRODUCING THE LANTERN AT LUTHER MANOR

THE LIGHT OF HOPE & FAITH IN THE NEXT STEPS OF RECOVERY

As part of our \$9 million revitalization of our Wauwatosa community, we proudly present The Lantern at Luther Manor, a rehabilitation program and therapy gym.

As a faith-based organization, we believe Psalm 119, which says that God and His Word are a lamp for our feet and light for our path—lanterns, if you will. In the uncertainty that often accompanies therapy and rehabilitation, the light hope and faith provided along with a patient's next steps are needed more than ever. At Luther Manor, we consider it a privilege to help guide you in your next steps toward recovery.

The Lantern at Luther Manor's rehabilitation and therapy gym offers:

A living area and gym, now on one floor, conveniently located within our community allowing all rehabilitation, long-term care, and assisted living residents to go back and forth between their living areas and the gym easily. Brightly-colored, well-lit, open spaces with full access to our outside courtyards and fresh air.

Newly upgraded therapy equipment providing our staff and residents with a wider range of exercise options to improve strength and mobility.

A fully functional kitchen to help residents learn to navigate daily tasks in their own homes.

The Lantern at Luther Manor Therapy Gym opened in the spring of 2024, while The Lantern at Luther Manor Rehab Center, opened late 2024.

GREAT ROOM CAFE & LOUNGE S NOW OPEN

WHAT IS IT? WHERE IS IT? WHEN IS IT OPEN? WHO CAN GO?

What is the Great Room Cafe? The Great Room Café is a brand new area in The Courtyards Assisted Living offering residents, staff, and guests snacks and beverages for purchase.

Where is it located? It is located in Courtyards Assisted Living, where the old ice cream parlor was.

When did it open, and what are its operating hours? The grand opening of the Café was Thursday, August 1st. Currently, its operating hours are Wednesdays from 1:30-4 pm and Thursdays from 9:30-11 am and 1:30-4 pm.

What does it offer to residents & their guests? The Café currently offers a variety of candies (Snickers, M&Ms, Reese's), freshly baked pastries from a local bakery, packaged cookies, fresh fruit, yogurt, juices, bottled water, coffee, and the fan favorite scoop ice cream. There is nothing in the café that costs more than \$2! Besides goodies, it offers a wonderful, warm environment for residents, guests, and staff to socialize, watch TV, read books from the library, and get to know our wonderful volunteers who fully run the Café.

Is it open to and for staff as well? Yes!! Many staff members have already stopped by to enjoy a delicious ice cream break.

What do you hope to see for the Cafe in the next few months or the coming year? We hope to be able to open the Cafe 5-7 days a week and provide more menu options such as sandwiches, salads, soup of the day, smoothies, yogurt parfaits, fruit cups, and more. We can't do this without volunteers! The Cafe will be completely run by volunteers.

What kind of volunteer opportunities exist, and how can folks sign up or get more information? We have openings most days for interested volunteers to help run the cafe! The hours will remain the same (9:30-11 am and 1:30-4 pm). Volunteers must feel comfortable with cash exchange.
